Handover Ceremony of Laboratory and X-Ray Equipment for Indira Gandhi Institute for Child Health at Kabul

December 28, 2014: The handover Ceremony of Laboratory and X-Ray Equipment for Indira Gandhi Institute for Child Health in Kabul was held on 28th December. This project has been funded by the Grant Assistance for Grassroots Projects (GAGP) by Japan with total amount of 119,779 USD.

Lab and X-Ray Equipment will play a great roll in fast diagnosis, treatment and to provide basic and advance health services to all referred patients in IPD, OT and OPD departments with achievement of good performance, work quality, standards for the child patients. Without Lab and X-Ray equipment it will be very difficult to keep the patients safe from death.

In general by utilization the modern Lab and X-Ray processing equipment the diagnosis will be fast easy and the treatment will be done in satisfactory and accurate manner. Further it provides satisfaction to both medical staff and patient guardian.

In his message dedicated to the occasion of handover ceremony His Excellency Mr. HIROSHI TAKAHASHI Ambassador of Japan to Afghanistan noted as follows;
